Secularism has covered over the true meaning of Christmas with tinsel, overspending and overeating, and has created a great deal of anxiety in a season that should be filled with joy and renewal.

In a similar way, the modern perception of Angels has been reduced to images of cute and benign young things that look like humans but with wings in pastel colours, and covered with glitter.

This lets us dismiss Angels as imaginary and cartoonish things that we don't have to take seriously.

The Bible makes it very clear that Angels are real, and terrifying.

They bring with them light, and the awesome power of God. They are not soft and sweet, they are stern and uncompromising and bring a message that is non-negotiable. When they appear, they always have to say, "Do not be afraid." Angels come to bring the holy, the awesome, surprising, and disturbing presence of God.

They bring their messages in person, in dreams, in visions, in the silence of prayer.

Let us not be foolish like Zechariah when an Angel comes but be ready and willing to hear the message they bring.

The forces that make us harried and hurried at Christmastide when we should be quietly waiting and watching, also seek to lull us into a false idea that the messengers of God are not real. They are, and scripture tells us so.
