Jonathan's Word

Life is not perfect. Even Jesus' twelve close followers faced the tough conditions of living as peasants in a dirt-poor little Roman territory. Until Christ returns in person, and in spite of conditions being much easier for us now, we will always be painfully aware of our limitations.

The first few verses of Isaiah 61 were claimed by Jesus as a kind of mission statement. It was his purpose to bring salvation, peace, healing and release from oppression. The Kingdom had broken into an earth much in need of God's reign. What we experience in Christ now is a foretaste of a glorious future when all are resurrected, heaven and earth are joined in a marvellous entity, and the Kingdom of God is fully manifest.

That's the big picture. In the meantime it's shoulder to the wheel building for the Kingdom of God. When people ask us what the final version of the Kingdom of God will look like we should not somewhat lamely answer, "Well, Jesus will be king." That's because the next question will be, "What will that look like?" Here we should be able to point to the things we are doing in anticipation of that future state. The work of the Leprosy Mission, which Gillian heads as its CEO, is a perfect example of Kingdom preparation work.

And it's not just the physical disease itself we would like to eliminate, but the stigma associated with the disease. Today people like the wonderful David Brooks, speak eloquently as to the negative effects of alienation upon society. Sufferers of leprosy have ben burdened with alienation for millennia! May God strengthen us in our resolve to lend a hand where we can towards doing God's work on earth. It's a wonderful opportunity to prepare for life in the Kingdom as it shall be.
