Tony's Word

Once, St Francis was alongside the Lake of Perugia, lodged at the house of a man devoted to him. He was inspired by God to go to make that Lent on an island in the lake. So St Francis asked this devout man that, for the love of Christ, he take him in his little boat to that island where no one lived, on the night of Ash Wednesday so that no one would notice. This man did so, and St Francis took nothing with him except two small loaves of bread. As his friend was departing, he asked him to kindly tell no one where he was and that he should not come for him until Holy Thursday.

Since there was no dwelling on the island, St Francis made a little den out of thick brush, and in this place he put himself in prayer and contemplation of heavenly things. And there he stayed the whole of Lent eating nothing except for half of one of those loaves. The other half, it is supposed, St Francis ate out of reverence for the fast of the blessed Christ, who fasted forty days and forty nights in the wilderness. And thus, with that half of a loaf St Francis drove from himself any vainglory had he, like Christ, eaten nothing at all.
