Richard's Word

One of the wonderful things about teaching is to see a student suddenly realise new insight. Luke's Gospel is an amazing collection of stories about Jesus, and he has a beautiful way of telling them. After delighting us with the almost "pastoral" story of two travellers on the road to Emmaus as Jesus patiently explains to them the significance of what they had heard and seen the sudden recognition that this is Jesus teaching them, walking with them and eating with them after he had died, makes them rush back to Jerusalem to share it with others.

Today's Gospel reading continues with the story of the two travellers back in Jerusalem speaking about this experience, when Jesus himself came among them. We learn of their fear, before Jesus reassures them he is real by asking for food and eating it.

In our own lives any experience of God is exciting but also causes apprehension. If we try to explain it to others who have not experienced what we did, it leaves us struggling to find appropriate communication. Yet like that couple on the road to Emmaus, we need to share. It is by sharing that our own faith grows.
