Bronwyn's Word

Tomorrow, the Church celebrates The Annunciation; the moment when the Angel Gabriel visits Mary to tell her that she is to bear the Son of God. Luke 1:26-38

Notice how very much more gentle Gabriel is with Mary than he was to Zechariah, who was deprived of his voice for answering back!

Mary is the exemplar of obedience to God. Being pregnant and unmarried could well have meant banishment in a society where community support and inclusion meant survival. Mary's response is brave and faith filled.

"Here I am, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."

Mary sings her Song of Praise: The Magnificat. This wonderfully joyful song celebrates all the promises of God that will be fulfilled and all that will be achieved through her son.

As we pray for ourselves and our troubled world this week, let us not feel overwhelmed or hopeless; but remember the Angel's promise to Mary and to us: "For nothing will be impossible for God."
