Please join us for a refreshment after the service.



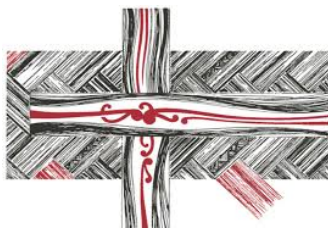

## Reflection

Have you ever wondered about the pattern that flows through the Eucharistic services in our wonderful New Zealand Prayer Book? Encounter, Praise, Confession, Forgiveness, God's Word and Call, and our Response are the elements of our worship that follow on one after the other.

Did you notice the same pattern in the reading from Isaiah 6:1-8 last Sunday?

Isaiah enters the Temple and encounters God, as we do when we attend church and turn our minds and hearts to God.

Like the angels that Isaiah hears, we sing praises; "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of Hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory."

With Isaiah, we confess that we are sinners, imperfect people who fall short of the glory of the Lord.

Isaiah cries out "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips..."

We too confess our sins; "We have sinned in what we have thought and said..."

With Isaiah, we hear the inexpressibly comforting words of God's forgiveness; "Your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." Isaiah is not lost, and neither are we.

Now that he has confessed and been forgiven, Isaiah is freed from the burden of sin and open to hear God's voice. He is not commanded, he is called. He is free to respond to God's call.

May we, with Isaiah, say "Here I am, send me!"
