John's Reflection

Easter 7

The reading in John's Gospel is part of the high-priestly prayer of chapter 17. A primary concern in this passage is the ongoing life of the Christian community. Jesus prays for at least four things:

- First, that the community be protected from evil
- Second, that the community be unified
- Third, that the community fulfil Jesus' joy
- Fourth, that the life of the church be distinct from the life of the world

To achieve this the Christian community is called to be united in our differences. The key to acting this out is to "Be Yourself". Henry Nouwen has this to say:

Often we want to be somewhere other than where we are, or even to be someone other than who we are. We need to compare ourselves constantly with others and wonder why we are not as rich, as intelligent, as simple, as generous or as saintly as they are. Such comparisons make us feel guilty, ashamed or jealous. It is very important to realise that our vocation is hidden in where we are and who we are. We are unique human beings, each with a call to realise in life what nobody else can, and to realise it in the concrete context of here and now.

We will never find our vocations by trying to figure out whether we are better or worse than others. We are good enough to do what we are called to do.
