Wayne and Kim are now in England and preparing to visit Europe. Details and photos on the noticeboard.

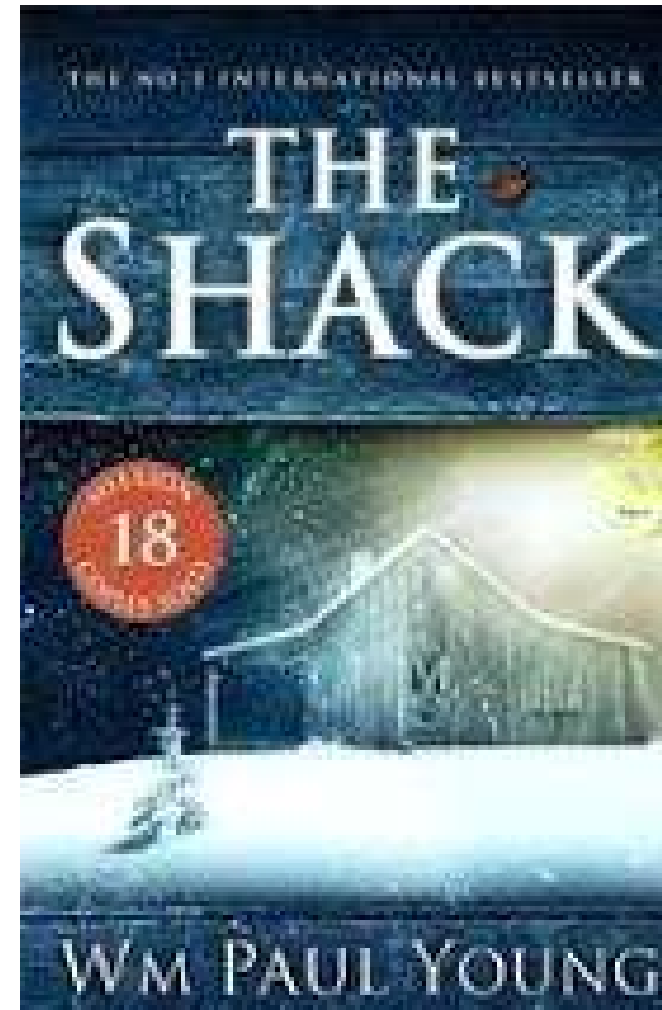
Rhythm 'n' Riggle - recommenced last week at Christ the King, with an attendance of 22.
