We have begun a new year and there are new opportunities and new things to look A weekly column by our Priest in Charge forward to for us as individuals and as a church. However there are many in our world

who have little that is bright to look forward to, and maybe even not much hope of things getting better. One way we can give hope and help to make a bright new year is to support the Leprosv Mission.

Some people think Leprosy is a thing of the past but unfortunately it is still very much with us. Not in our country perhaps, but certainly in some of our Pacific neighbours. Every two minutes someone is diagnosed with leprosy. 99% of these people live in poor communities with weak immune systems and limited healthcare. Leprosy is a bacterium thought to be passed on by coughing or sneezing; destroying nerves in the hands and feet causing loss of feeling and making people vulnerable to injury. It is still treated with superstition and fear and because of this, often concealed. Leprosy is curable with drugs and if treated early damage is minimal.

Jesus brought new beginnings to outcast people by healing them of this dreaded disease and restoring them to the community. We can continue Jesus' mission and give a new beginning through supporting the work of The Leprosy Mission - later this year we will have a special Sunday Focus on The Leprosy Mission, and we will give our support as a Mission District. I also encourage you to consider giving support through individual donations.

Next Sunday, 26 January, marks World Leprosy Day. During this week I invite you to pray for the work of The Leprosy Mission and those suffering from this dreaded disease - for help, hope and healing. You may also like to use the Prayer for World Leprosy Day printed below.
