

The Gift of "Earth"


We are indeed living in very strange times. Life, death and economic survival are very much consuming us. Before the Covid-19 pandemic there was huge concern about the future of our planet, Earth. It is all important and all connected, and we as people of faith and as people of God have a distinctive perspective. These thoughts directed me back to something a friend gave me a long, long time ago. Knowing my interest in stories and parables, he shared the following parable:

If the earth were only a few feet in diameter, floating above a field somewhere, people would come from everywhere to marvel at it. People would walk around it, marvelling at its big pools of water, its little pools and the water flowing between the pools. People would marvel at the bumps on it, and the holes in it, and they would marvel at the very thin layer of gas surrounding it and the water suspended in the gas. The people would declare it was sacred because it was the only one, and they would protect it so it would not be hurt. The ball would be the greatest wonder known, and people would come to pray to it, to be healed, to gain knowledge, to know beauty and to wonder how it could be. People would love it, and defend it with their lives because they would somehow know that their lives, their own roundness, could be nothing without it. If the earth were only a few feet in diameter ...

What a gift! If the earth were a small and precious ball hovering near your letterbox, who wouldn't marvel at it? Who wouldn't want to protect it, take care of it? If I had made such a beautiful and precious thing, I'm not so sure I'd be keen to give it to someone else - and yet God did. God handed creation to us, ourselves part of creation, to work with God. Because of this I know and accept that I have a task and a place in God's creation. I know that God is still intimately involved with his creation. I know that God is still creating and inviting me to work with him. God is inviting you too.
