# Wayne's Word

A weekly column by our Priest in Charge

Jesus is King, but our understanding of what it is to be "King" might prevent us from seeing what it actually means. What follows is just one way of trying to describe what this might look like – but it

gives an idea of the kind of "King" Jesus is:

Jesus is the kind of King who doesn't make a big deal of being King. Jesus is the kind of King who says come over on Saturday and watch the rugby in my giant screen surround sound media room. Or, bring the whole family for a picnic in my gardens and a swim in the pool. Check out the books in my library and borrow any that take your fancy.

Jesus is also the kind of King who says, "You're concreting your driveway this weekend. What time are you starting? I'll be there." Or, "you need a night out so I'll babysit the kids." And even, "you'd like to learn how to sew or paint or cook - I can help with that."

Jesus knows how life works best. Knows us better than we know ourselves. Knows the best path for our lives. However he is not pushy or overbearing. He is certainly not a pompous know-it-all. He will be alongside us, offering his wisdom, making suggestions, perhaps even asking and answering questions. But in the end it is up to us. We can choose to listen and follow, or do our own thing.

And even then Jesus is not the kind of King who says that because we haven't done what he said, we are to be punished. Nor will he be petulant and say that because we took no notice of him, he is no longer going to take any interest in us.

Jesus is the kind of King who will continue to walk alongside, seek our best interests, offer guidance. He will be there whether we notice and acknowledge him, or not. Jesus is the King overflowing with grace and patience for even the most reluctant and stubborn of us.

Jesus said things that kind of blow your mind for a so-called King:

I came not to be served but to serve others and to give my life as a ransom for many. (Matthew 20:28) Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first among you must be the slave of everyone else. (Mark 10:43-44) Whoever is the greatest should be the servant of the others. (Matthew 23:11)

Jesus actually put all this into practice. He did what he said. He walked the talk. He literally put his body on the line. Eventually it meant he was nailed to a cross wearing not a crown of gold and jewels, but of thorns. Jesus the King gave his life that we might live.

Jesus is the kind of King who you give allegiance to not because it is demanded, but because nothing else makes sense.


