"Remember these are just a few suggestions," the new curate went on, "I'm only trying to encourage you to see what you could do. Like Mrs Jennings - I know you were given a stunning necklace for your fifteenth wedding anniversary, because I was there. There will be someone you know who would be blown away to wear it for a couple of months."

He looked across the aisle to the vicar. "Just yesterday the vicar showed me his new pride and joy in his library. A soft black leather chair with twin footrests, drinks cabinet, speakers and massage function. I know you can think of someone from the family centre who would love to try it out.

"And before you can say 'practice what you preach young man' ..." Here the new curate held up some sheets of paper, "... you will notice my notes are hand written. 
one day, or one week, or one month even. A giving that is for a lifetime and is life-changing.
