#### Keep Up the Good Work

Things are going pretty well down here in Aotearoa

New Zealand. The corona virus is raging, mutating and claiming thousands of lives throughout the world; yet we are largely free from all that. We can pretty much go about our daily lives as we want. We are able to go on holiday – within our country. We may visit family, friends, neighbours. Go out to a restaurant. Go on a picnic. Swim in the river or sea or pool. Catch a fish. Visit the library or the mall. Relax in a hammock and read a book ... you get the idea.

However in all this there is one important thing we need to remember and live by. This is January 2021. It is most definitely not January 2020 or 2019. We now live in a very different world where the pleasant rhythm of life may be shattered in a moment. For sure life is pretty good for us at the moment. However ...

As a nation we have to guard our borders, our health system, our policies and procedures, vigilantly. As individuals we need to keep up the practices that have enabled us to be where we are: washing our hands, monitoring our health, scanning and signing in. Because the Covid-19 virus is not done with us yet. It's a tricky little blighter. Just one small slip, one tiny opening, one overlooked procedure and it could all break out.

Now that things seem to be going so well we are in danger of being complacent. This we have to guard against. The *Cambridge Academic Content Dictionary* defines "complacency" as "a feeling of calm satisfaction with your own abilities or situation that prevents you from trying harder." The Bible also has much to say on this subject. There are, as you might expect, some hard-hitting words in the Book of Proverbs: "For waywardness kills the simple,and the complacency of fools destroys them" (1:32).

As followers of Jesus, it is our calling to keep up the good work and show the way. To guard against indifference and encourage good behaviour. We are called to be those who keep up the disciplines and behaviours that have put us in such a good place – even though it looks like we no longer need to. For if we don't, there could be a huge disaster. As the verse in Proverbs says "the complacency of fools will destroy them".

Yes we are to enjoy the good things of life that we are indeed blessed with at the moment. However we are not to take them for granted. They are a gift, and are to be received and treasured as such. We are to keep working to preserve all this for us as a nation, and hold out a light to our world.
