When I Needed a Neighbour ...

This time last year we were still in total lockdown,

confined to home with options and activities severely limited. We were constantly encouraged to be kind and look out for our neighbours. I believe this is what helped us survive and finally exit that dark time.

When you look around our country now you could be excused for thinking that everything is okay. But though much is good, not everything is in fact okay. There are "neighbours" who are suffering.

Jesus told a parable in response to the question "Who is my neighbour?" (*The Good Samaritan*, Luke 10:25-37) One thing that can be taken from this is that a "neighbour" is anyone who is in need of assistance. Specifically *our* assistance. In Matthew's Gospel (25:31-46) Jesus told another kind of parable which said that when we help someone in need, we are actually helping Jesus. Even with all that is good in our country, there are many who require assistance, who are in need. These are our neighbours.

There are people who have funds but are unable to buy or build a house. People who are able to pay that cannot get a place to rent. Then there are so many who cannot afford accommodation, or are in substandard or overcrowded conditions. Or living in temporary and unsuitable accommodation like motels. And yes it is hard to believe, but people are going hungry in our nation. We face huge problems to do with housing, food and employment. There are no simple 'magic wand' answers. However these people are our neighbours and we have to do something.

As followers of Jesus, here is part of the "something". First off we are to pray. Pray for those in need, that they know they are cared about and not on their own. Pray that they know the comfort, strength and peace God can give. Pray for a spirit of generosity and grace and care for all involved in these situations. Pray for wisdom, and motivation, and release of resources, among those who are in positions to make the changes and take the actions that make the difference.

Pray that as a nation we will continue to be kind and care, and look after our neighbours. Pray that we will be patient and not grow weary of doing good.

For us as individuals it means being aware of our neighbours, the people around us. Are there some who have needs we can help meet? Yes, please continue to contribute generously to the foodbank. Yes, please do keep your eyes and ears open. Yes, please carry on sharing the blessings you have.

Please know that as we pray and share it makes a huge difference – for us and for our neighbours.
