Queen's Birthday and Jesus the King

It seems to me most people are pretty sure that the Queen, Queen Elizabeth II, exists; that she is real. Further, it seems

people not only believe but know she is over there in England. Some people have seen her, some people have spoken to her, many people know someone who has dealt with her. However the fact the Queen exists, that she is on the throne, and real, makes little or no difference at all to most people's lives except of course if you live to be 100; then you get a lovely card.

For most people though, the Queen is real, but makes no difference to their lives. Now here's something to consider: it seems to me that many people regard Jesus, who we Christians say is our King, in the same way! That is, people have heard of Jesus, know about Jesus; believe he lived and died even, but it makes no impact, no difference to their lives. The Queen is on the throne in England, Jesus is on the throne in heaven - and it is the same thing!

People are happy to mark the King's, that is Jesus', birthday at Christmas - and take the holiday. People are happy to mark the King's, Jesus', other "big day" at Easter - and take the holiday. They are even happy to sing songs to the King because that is what you do: sing songs to the King on his birthday. But for so many it means no more than singing "God Save the Queen". And that is it, the occasion is observed, the holiday enjoyed and you just get on with life. The Queen is not given a second thought while Jesus the King does not even get a third or a fourth thought!

Food for thought and a challenge to us to live so that Jesus is more than a historical figure or figurehead. A challenge to show that Jesus is real and makes a life-giving difference by our words and actions. Three cheers for Jesus our King on this Queen's Birthday weekend!
