## Harvey's Word

I am delighted that this morning the Rev. Tony Stroobant will be the Celebrant at our Eucharist at Christ the King. Tony, along with Pastor Derek Christensen, have for some years now given extremely good service to our Churches. It was only when I became a Minister of the Word in the Uniting Church of Australia that I began to see how insular and self focused our Anglican Church has become since we failed Church Unity back in the 1970's. We have lost all sense of the power of Jesus' prayer that we may all become one even as he and the Father are one. This is regrettable in the extreme. Having Tony and Derek ministering in our midst is a great blessing and one that I warmly welcome.

This month our Liturgy is the one that gives thanks for Creation and Redemption. This is a somewhat curious mix of themes. It features a Song of Praise with very familiar descriptions and all the better for that. I have always understood that it was composed by the Rev Bruce Keeley but whether that is true I have never ascertained. It is the sort of thing I could well imagine Bruce doing. Like most of our services there are a variety of choices within the service, especially around the Song of Praise and the Confession, and we will take advantage of these through the month.

The Transfiguration of our Lord (Mark 9: 2-9) features twice in our Church Year. The first time is on the second Sunday in Lent. It also has a special day this coming Friday, August  $6^{th}$ . Associated with the Feast of the Transfiguration is Hiroshima Day 1945 and World Peace Day. We encourage you this Friday to read the above passage, reflect upon it and upon Hiroshima Day and to pray for the peace of the world. Shalom, Harvey
