Harvey's Word

Last Sunday I led the worship of all three Mission Districts. This is a first for me. It is challenging to think that in our three Mission Districts we traverse every community between the Tasman and Pacific Oceans within the lower far north region.

We began in Christ the King with 38 parishioners present then on to All Saints where there were nine people before moving on in the late afternoon to Holy Trinity where nineteen parishioners attended the Eucharist. In each and every case there was a fine period of hospitality and fellowship following the service. Starting this Sunday, I expect to be in the area from Sunday through to Wednesday although that will vary from time to time. In this time my initial priorities are these.

To make sure there is worship in all our churches as rostered. I am intending to follow the roster as inherited. This can be changed but only by the agreement of all Governing Bodies and myself.

My second responsibility will be to meet regularly (weekly or fortnightly) with the leadership teams of each Mission District. The details of how this will happen will be worked out on the first occasion I meet with each Mission District. This will help me to understand how best I can support each Mission District in the time that I have available.

My third responsibility will be to provide crisis pastoral care in all three Mission Districts. In this I will be guided by each Leadership Team.

I have a hope that we might develop a fourth area of work and that involves gathering all three Leadership Teams to meet and think about those matters that affect us all. This will include how ministry is being offered and resourced across the region, how the Priest in Charge is being funded, and how we understand the way in which God is leading us across the whole area served by the three Mission Districts. That is a hope for the future but one I would love to see being put into practice not too far away.

In finishing might I say that I have never before worked simultaneously across three Mission Districts. I will make mistakes which I intend to learn from and there will be opportunities I hope we can grasp. In everything may we give God the glory as we enjoy the challenges put before us.
