Harvey's Word

It is a delight to be able to write to you now that we are back in the north. I am extremely grateful for the

way in which everyone has coped with the difficulties of the Covid. My thanks in particular to our Wardens, Jo and Lindsay and our Administrator, Fay. Once worship was allowed, I was rung by the Rev Tony Stroobant who offered to continue to lead the worship at Christ the King and the Rev. John McClean the same at St Paul's. My thanks to them both. Their ministries have been much appreciated. Before I came back up here, I had a telephone conversation with the Bishop in which several things were agreed. The first was that the Bishop has delegated to me the responsibility for ensuring that we have a Priest in Charge in place before the end of January. Because we are a Mission District and not a Parish, we do not get to elect representatives to form a nominating committee. Instead, I have been asked by the Bishop to form such a committee in consultation with the Wardens. I have asked Jo, Lindsay and Fay to represent us in discussions with our prospective Priest in Charge and yes, there is such a person. AND NO, we cannot ask questions!!!!! This is, as always, a very confidential process. One thing we can say is that as before, it will not be a full time appointment. We are unable at this time to day what proportion of a full time job it will be. That will be part of the negotiations with our people. One small note on housing. We should not assume that the new Priest in Charge will live in the Mangawhai Vicarage. We have two Vicarages and these days clergy quite often ask to live in their own house all of which are possible.

One of the requirements the Bishop has for us is that we can obtain from the Diocesan Executive Officer, Sonia Maughan, a Certificate of Means. In essence this says that Sonia is confident that we can pay for the Priest in Charge and that we can house the person. Which brings us to the next point.

The appointment, if made, will be a joint appointment between ourselves and the Paparoa Mission District. Both Mission Districts have to agree that the Bishop has found the right person. Both Mission Districts have to agree that the Budget employing the Priest in Charge can be found. To assist this, we are forming a new body to oversee the formation of a Regional Partnership between the two Mission Districts. Note, this is a partnership, it is not a new body. There is NO intention to reform the old Paparoa Parish. But both units will have to agree that we have the right person and both will have to agree that together they can fund the appointment with an appropriate splitting of the costs etc. I have asked Jo, Lindsay and Fay to work with the Paparoa people in forming this new partnership and to see if we can agree on the important matters prior to the appointment being made. Once the Priest in Charge is installed, it is my hope that this regional partnership body will continue with the Priest in Charge in the Chair.

The aim is to have all this work completed by the middle of December in the hope that our new Priest in Charge can be installed some time in January. So, there will be a lot of work for our people. We will keep you informed as best we can but once the conversations start with the prospective Priest in Charge nothing further will be said until those conversations are completed and the Bishop is able to make an announcement.
