Harvey's Word

In 1975 which was my second year as a Priest in Charge of a Parochial District, our Synod decided to have a Diocesan wide Thanksgiving Programme, formerly known as a Stewardship Programme and before that the Wells Campaign. We needed this badly. We knew this because the Diocesan Secretary had told us so. He used words of one syllable which we appreciated as we were very rural. We did very well in the Campaign and I learned a lot. Ever since, whenever I have been Priest in Charge or Vicar, there has been an annual Thanksgiving Campaign. It became a staple of the Church's year along with Harvest Festival, the Parish Fair and Mothering Sunday.

We learned that to return to God a proportion of that which we had been given was indeed a means of blessing. We also knew that whilst we might keep the same proportion our actual thank offering would increase if our income increased and similarly if our income decreased then so would our thank offering. The key to this way of thinking is the proportion. We learned that through prayer, discussion with our family and prayer again we could decide upon an appropriate proportion from which the actual amount can be calculated. E.g. If our weekly income is \$500 and we have decided to return to God as a thank offering 5% of this income then each Sunday we will place in the offering basket the sum of \$25.

We also learned that in the Bible there is no preferred proportion. From the Old Testament we know about the tithe (10%). But the one person whom Jesus commended was the widow who gave 100%. St Paul appears to prefer choosing a proportion and using that as your basis for giving and that proportion can be 1% upwards.

It was my hope that we might engage with this topic over the next five weeks excluding Labour Weekend. As always, the pesky virus has taken part in the discussion and I think we will have to leave this to one side. This is a pity. But then I might write more about this in the next few weeks.
