Covid 19 Traffic Light Red and Us

The Government has set out the regulations for Traffic Light Red which we are assuming will be our colour once the change is made. Essentially we can have up to 100 people in church, inside or out, at any one time <u>provided they are all vaccinated and have shown proof of vaccination</u>. If an unvaccinnated person is present then the number drops to 10.

We are now in receipt of a draft diocesan policy which will be reviewed by the Governing Body on Tuesday night in order to send a response back on Wednesday. It is very thorough and will mean some changes so watch this space and once we know what is happening there will be a full briefing in church.

Harvey's Word

We are fast approaching a time which I suspect none of us ever thought would happen. How do we sustain our life as a Eucharistic Community when under attack by a virus called Covid 19? The government has taken the first steps in declaring us to be governed by what has become colloquially known as the traffic light system. This has very clear requirements for us as a worshipping community. In addition, we are a Diocesan Church which means that we are also governed by what the Bishop and the Diocesan Council rule. This makes for a complex and probably difficult life for us all.

The government position is clear. In traffic light "red" if we wish to have more than 10 people in church at any one time then they will need to be vaccinated and to show proof of that vaccination. If we wish to have a service for the unvaccinated then that will be limited to ten at a time. The Diocesan Position is inevitably slower to be formulated as it has to take the Government directives into account. The Bishop has written and said that the Diocesan Council at its meeting on the 25th November will receive a report from the Health and Safety Committee. That report will be discussed and a preliminary policy formulated. That policy will then be forwarded to all Governing Bodies who will have until 8am on Thursday December 2nd to make a response. The Diocesan Council will then meet again, review what has been forwarded by the Governing Bodies, make any necessary amendments to the policy and then this will be distributed for action. The Bishop has said in his letter that based on a risk assessment and the recent consultation undertaken with clergy and ministry unit governing bodies, the policy is likely to include a requirement for all clergy, licensed lay ministers, and volunteers working in face-to-face roles to be vaccinated. It is also likely to set a requirement for vaccination certificates to be used in order to hold gatherings for events including services of worship, with an exemption process for gatherings where there is a decision not to use certificates. Along with the policy we will also distribute a chart and guidelines for gatherings and services within the new framework. I am particularly interested to hear from people whose health is compromised to the degree that they think the risk of mixing with unvaccinated people is too high a risk. Likewise, I would like to hear from those who are choosing to be unvaccinated so that we might discuss how to sustain their life in worship and the Eucharist. In Christ,


