Harvey's Word

As mentioned on Sunday our Governing Body met through the week to complete the questionnaire sent to us by Bishop Ross. The questionnaire asked our opinions of which choices we would

recommend when the new traffic light system comes into play.

In summary, the Governing Body preferred to have two services a Sunday. One which was open for everyone to attend and one which was for people who had been double vaccinated.

We also preferred to receive from the Bishop and the Diocesan Council an overarching policy on these matters but then we would be able to choose our own path within this overarching policy. We did not want a one size fits all policy made by the Diocesan Council.

The Bishop has told us that the Diocesan Council will issue our Diocesan Policy at their meeting in the last week of November.

We certainly live in interesting times.

In amongst all this we continue to remember great men and women of the Church. This week Charles Simeon comes into focus. I would love to have heard him preach. Simeon was born in 1759 and educated at Eton and Cambridge. Following graduation, he was appointed a Fellow of King's College after which came ordination and appointment as the Vicar of Holy Trinity, Cambridge. He was one of the first evangelicals in the Church of England, John Wesley being another but who took a different path. Simeon was Vicar from 1783 to 1836 when he died, a period of 53 years. His parishioners were irate at his appointment as they wished nothing to do with this newfangled evangelicalism. What the parishioners heard was a vigorous but gracious proclamation of the gospel in its evangelical style with an emphasis on biblical exposition focused on the person of Jesus Christ. Simeon himself described his aim as "to humble the sinner, to exalt the Saviour, to promote holiness". It was a new emphasis in preaching and aroused considerable opposition in some quarters. This opposition led to Simeon being locked out of his church for the first ten years of his appointment. Eventually, he was allowed into the church and his ministry flourished.

It is however as a man of prayer and a pastor that he is best remembered, for his example inspired many to win others for Christ. Together with his friends, Simeon did much to change the ethos of the Church of England in the early nineteenth century, bringing a new zeal in devotion, a deep love of others, and an enhanced standard of clerical duties.
