# Harvey's Word

Christine and I once visited the site where John the Baptist preached and baptised. We were staying with the Australian Ambassador to Jordan and he had received an official invitation to go to the place where John baptised Jesus and there to observe the worship and the ceremonies. We went too. The site is a river crossing for traffic from Jerusalem to Jordan and Syria, i.e., very popular. Animals needed watering as did their owners so a place to stop and rest, therefore market stalls etc. Up behind the crossing is a hill named after Elisha one of THE great prophets of Israel, therefore a place of religious significance. Just a great place for a revival ministry. When we were there the excavations went back to the late 5<sup>th</sup> century but that was really only a beginning.

On different trips, and separately, we went to the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem. There we went down into the cave where the birth of Jesus is remembered. In the morning when I was there, we were rushed through as there were many pilgrim parties waiting their turn to enter the cave. Later in the day I returned by myself and found it empty so I just sat there, looked, wondered and worshipped. Almost certainly Jesus was born in a cave and why not, safe, secure, warm and dry? But this cave? Almost certainly not. There was no GPS in those days. But we were in a cave, we were somewhere close and this was the place where Christians came to remember.

The Advent season of hope invites our recollection and thinking about those places where we have been which became for us signs of hope, places where we could go, be quiet, remember and worship. These need not, will not, necessarily be places in the land of the Holy One. But they will be places where the Holy One was present, with you, One who has promised to remain with us forever. And therefore, we hope.
