building.

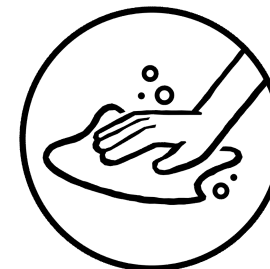
Last year Christ the King Vestry asked Lindsay and Celia to help us with how
