## Peter's Word

We are choosy about what we remember about others: be it a cricketer or a politician, be it an artist, a writer, a musician, a saint . . . or a sinner. In Paul Simon's line:

*"A man hears what he wants to hear  
and disregards the rest."*

I'm pretty sure it's the case for Jesus: we love the Nativity story. A baby! Shepherds! A star! I have favourite Gospel verses and a favourite miracle. We choose not to remember much about the sheer hell of Christ's wilderness fast. It's not surprising: the Lectionary propels us from the baptism, directly into the wilderness. Then it telescopes a 3-year ministry into a 6-week countdown to crucifixion. No wonder we find the desert weeks forgettable.

We maybe choose to forget that one of Jesus' ancestors had done something similar: hidden away in the same inhospitable bits of Judea. Our psalm today may contain a clue with David's "dry and weary land where there is no water". But who knows? We choose to remember David's other fame (Goliath) or infamy (Uriah and Bathsheba).

Ireland's famous St Patrick also had a wilderness time, but few remember his years as a slave in Ireland. We choose to recall the Shamrock Sermon (was it a symbol of the Holy Trinity?) or St Paddy's alleged banishing snakes from Ireland. The equally famous St Brigid of Ireland is also said to have been born into slavery, and is thought to have been formed in her faith by years of poverty. But we choose to remember her mainly as a holy abbess of Kildare.

Many of our heroes really learned to pray, it seems, in those weeks, months, or years in whatever wilderness life threw at them.

Every year, Lent challenges Christians to turn anew to God in prayer. Let's choose to make these next 4 weeks memorable as we lay down some comforts in order to take up the challenge to pray in the silences. It may change all our memories of 2022!

**THEME & READINGS:  
How to Pray in a Time of Sorrow**

OT: Psalm 63: 1-8  
Gospel: Luke 13: 1-9



*The Lenten theme this week is a logical follow-on from last week's emphasis on lamenting prayer. One of the challenging questions we face today is how to pray in a time of suffering: as we face war and a pandemic. Our readings leave us no option but to answer God's call to compassion. May we be drawn deeper into the mystery of God's infinite grace and all-embracing justice as we journey through Lent in worship.*

**SCRIPTURE SENTENCE:** As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts, says the Lord. *Isaiah 55:9*

**COLLECT for the 3<sup>RD</sup> SUNDAY in LENT:**

**God of grace and goodness, you know that by reason of our frailty we cannot but fail; keep us always under your protection and lead us to all things profitable to our salvation; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**
