Tony's Word

Early in a new parish, I was given a long list of people who needed visiting, most of whom turned out to have had no church connection whatsoever. One was a dear, elderly, bedridden woman who mistook me for the previous minister. "My word," she said, "You've put on some condition since I saw you last."

The parish matriarch agreed that my predecessor had, indeed, been a prodigious visitor. The down side, she said, was that he effectively had only one sermon, and told me that if she heard one more sermon on the "love of God" she thought she might scream! So I was warned......

Almost everyone would agree with the idea that "God is love". But what does it mean? "Love", at worst is a somewhat abstract word; even at its best it can mean many very different things.

The parable set for today- traditionally called the Parable of the Prodigal Son although I prefer the parable of the Loving Father- "earths" one aspect of what we might mean by "God is love." God is like the loving father who will suffer every indignity in order that his errant son- both his errant sons- might remain included within the love and security of the family of faith.

Many- perhaps even most - of Jesus' parables tease out, in practical terms and in various ways, what is meant by "God is love." The parables of the Lost Sheep, and the Sower and the Seed, for example, are not primarily about "us" at all, but are about God.

Take time this week to read a few of Jesus' parables and try to pick what he was saying about God.
