Tony's Word

KNOCKED OFF HIS HORSE?

In one of today's readings (Acts 9: 1-20), we have an account of the conversion of Saul, who became Paul, not converted to "Christianity"- as that term had not yet been invented- but as a follower of Jesus within the Jewish tradition.

Many preachers I have heard seem to imagine him to have been knocked off his horse by the experience.

But historical research tells us that in those days only the very highest ever rode a horse, and even a Roman general might be fortunate enough to ride only an ass or a donkey.

None of the translations I have read says that Saul/Paul was actually riding anything at all.

Like almost everyone in those days, he was most likely walking.

Riding or walking, the important point is that "something" happened on the Damascus Road that day that changed his life, and that of the Christian community, for the next 2000 years.

Today, well established research tells us that people mostly become Christians in one of two ways: suddenly "knocked off their horse", or slowly and gently and solidly growing into faith in Christ.

Neither is "better" than the other, the research says, either in terms of personal meaning or of long-term commitment.

Think back.

At what point, or points, did your life in Christ- however you interpret thatsuddenly or slowly become real for you? Either way, let us give thanks to God!
