Peter's Word

Every autumn we get thrust outside into the theological paddocks and hear Christ speaking of being the Good Shepherd. What's *not* heard is why Jesus focused on this 23rd Psalm.

It was his controversial healing of a rank outsider – a poor man whose blindness was blamed on him. The public always has to find somebody to blame. Look at the polls! Or the poor or unwell folk who beg outside my supermarket: "must be their own fault" goes the public script.

The successful copers in society are the modern gate-keepers. But Jesus declared gate-keepers irrelevant. He said that *he* is the gate, and the gate is open. That goes for church, too.

The lockdowns underline this. In 200 years, there had never been a way for any lost sheep with a mobile phone to peek into church without having to get through the front door. But on-line church at times drew three or four times the public that my previous parish sees in person. Viewers didn't have to be there when we clergy said so. Or sit when we sat or sing when we sang. Or agree with *my* bleating on!

It's not surprising that the anxious lambs began testing the waters of on-line church. This is still a time of high anxiety. People are looking for something to hold on to as the trusted foundations are shaken. And even if the gated island nation of Aotearoa New Zealand is no longer so afraid of Covid19, people still are afraid - scared about housing, the cost of living, climate change, the flu ... so it's no surprise that many are still tuning in to the open electronic gate to God. Now's not the time for churches to stop live-streaming.

The challenge is how we package our on-line worship, and then how we welcome any searching sheep - now or in that mythical time when we imagine *things might get back to normal*. When and if they tiptoe through the gates.

Can we find a way to show different sheep from other folds in the door? Are we ready to sit alongside people who're long-term unemployed because their jobs have vanished in the Covid smoke?

Or will we default to the people we've always sat by, talked with, included, and befriended? Especially if newcomers' pastoral theology doesn't fit ours?
