Peter's Word

One of the joys for me of coming to live in Northland has been the closeness of the actual bay where Chief Ruatara brought Samuel Marsden to preach to his people.

Each time I've been there I've been moved by the history, and I think, by the Holy Spirit. Sitting up the hill overlooking Oihi Bay and the Marsden Cross, I've meditated on the first Mission work in the North.

I've imagined the sailing ship anchored down in the Bay. I've reflected on how that first phase of our church's history was essentially about a missionary Church, with CMS missionaries committed to a Maori Church through the establishment of the gospel among Maori people. Hence the Maori name for the Anglican Church *Te Haahi Mihinare*, the Church Missionary. In June, 1857 Bishop Selwyn called the first General Synod of the Church in Parnell – it was there that the first constitution of our church in New Zealand was signed.

We have journeyed 166 years since then, and those early tensions of indigenous and settler ministry have always been close to the surface. So, in 1928 the Church took the first effective step to address the issue with the appointment of Fred Bennett as the first Maori Bishop and Bishop of Aotearoa. It took 50 more years - till 1978 – for autonomy to flow to Maori ministry through the formation of Te Pihopatanga o Aotearoa.

But it took us just 14 years for the 1992 General Synod to ratify a new constitution forming us into one church made up by 3 Tikanga of Maori, Pakeha and Pacifica. 1 church: 3 tikanga. Remind you of anything?

This current constitution is called "Te Pouhere" – a seagoing word which means "mooring-post." We live by the sea. We know the image well.

The constitution was an answer to the question: *How do we do church in an ethnically diverse group of people within this part of the Pacific – the indigenous inhabitants of this land along with waves of later settlers, as well as the people of the Islands of the Pacific – Fiji, Samoa, Tonga*
