Bernard's Word

Do you think that perhaps one of the most frequent requests we humans make is for, "a bit of peace and quiet"? It could be that our call for that peace and quiet is a wish to have the time, with an untroubled mind, to think something through to have clarity of thought.

"Quiet" seems to be a state which is very difficult for humans to reach and sustain. It is almost as if we are uncomfortable in, or a little frightened by, silence. Or perhaps, over influenced by the words of Rudyard Kipling, "If you can fill the unforgiving minute/With sixty seconds worth of . . ." Often when we come to church our conversations continue into the nave and go on until the service starts! Yet this time in the nave is a lovely opportunity to be still, to contemplate our faith and the forthcoming service; perhaps to offer silent prayer. Our quietness also means that we do not intrude into the stillness and contemplation of others in the congregation.

So, what about "Peace"? We could say that there are two aspects of peace. There is peace between nations, between cultures, between individuals. A relationship peace. Consider the Reverend Phil Dyer's reflection on Psalm 133:

"How wonderful and good it is when people live together in peace. Blessings pour upon them and cover them with fragrance. Like a heavy dew that saturates the ground refreshes the earth and fills the land with harvest, so it is when people learn to live in peace."



The other aspect is an inner peace; a person's state of mind between conscience, soul, and God. An individual peace. We need to go to the word of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. He said, ". . . my peace I leave with you." (John 14: 27). He also said that he had given us his words and teaching, ". . . that in me you might have peace." (John 16:33). He told that he came as a servant: there might be a clue here. A pathway to this peace has been offered by Mother Teresa of Calcutta: "The fruit of silence is prayer, The fruit of prayer is faith, The fruit of faith is love.

The fruit of love is service, The fruit of service is peace."
