Peter's Word

Peter's Word

This week in the Ministry of the Word, we're continuing with the subject of money and ways to share the resources of this world, but this time, it is connected with the idea of **mercy**. The prophet Amos was watching the destruction of his nation at the hands of an invader (remind you of anywhere today?). Amos has nothing but uncomfortable words for people who have no mercy, and ignore the suffering and destruction around them. Then, in a very Old Testament-sounding parable, Jesus leaves little room for doubt about the consequence of wealth that is not mercifully shared for the physical salvation of the poor. The Hebrew prophets leave us in no doubt that "The Lord hears the cry of the poor" (Ps 34). Genuine prophets are red-hot on the Godly requirement that wealth is to be shared and distributed equitably. For those of us who are among the wealthy (which pretty much includes anyone reading this today) God's word is direct and challenging – the poor need our merciful generosity as well as our voice which challenges the wealthy to share. But the poor also need our optimism, and we are called to raise prophetic voices that trust in God's purposes – which trump human wisdom or politically correct economic systems. This prophetic call is a significant focus of the Gospel of Luke, and it's an integral part of our mission as Church. May we be challenged to plant our roots deep in the pure water of the River of God. and seek 21st Century ways to be good news to the poor as we worship this week. – Rev Peter Minson
