Tony's Word

Take Up My Cross? Really?

In today's Gospel reading, one verse stands out.

If any would be my followers

let them deny themselves

and take up their cross and follow me. (Luke 14:27)

Deny ourselves?

Take us our cross?

Oh, really?

Jesus' words could hardly be less fashionable these days.

Aren't we taught to find ourselves, to fulfil ourselves, rather than deny ourselves?

And to at last lay down the burdens, the "crosses", imposed on us by others and by society?

So what is going on here?

As Rev Peter said last Sunday, it is helpful to remember the terrible times that the Christian community was living through back then, and that prompted Luke to recollect these words of Jesus from decades before, and to write them down.

The Temple had been destroyed.

Deadly Roman persecution of both Christians and Jews continued.

So what to do?

Above all, keep the faith!

Even if it meant denying yourself, and felt like carrying your own cross, above all- keep the faith!

But NZ is not dominated by an invading power that has burned and looted every church in the land, and imprisoned countless Christian troublemakers. So what is the relevance today of Jesus' call to deny ourselves if necessary, and to carry our cross?

Remember again the context of the persecution of the church in New Testament times: a fascist, totalitarian Roman state, which was a near repetition of the fascist, totalitarian Babylonian state in which the community of faith found itself in Jeremiah's time.

Tragically, anti-democratic, totalitarian forces seem never to be finally defeated, and are on the rise again today- in Russia, in China, and even in the USA itself

And so, may we all be alert and alive to what it might possibly mean in the foreseeable future to be asked to deny ourselves, and to take up our cross, in the name of the Gospel.
