In two days', time New Zealanders and Australians will be remembering with gratitude and respect the sacrifice of life by thousands of young people given in battles for freedom from oppression by extreme individuals or regimes.

In the history of humankind there seems to have been an almost inevitable persistence in the need for some to exert dominance over others and a not surprising response from those "others" to resist. Hardly ever has the "conflict" been resolved by starting and pursuing negotiation . . . resort to such coming only after the slaughter. Fighting seems to have been always the answer, and those best able to fight have been the young. Consequently, the fields of history are littered with the battered and lifeless bodies of the young together with their potential, their dreams and their hopes.

Today, in our so-called enlightened societies we still find demagogues willing to plunge their own populations and those whom they wish to subjugate into horrendous and horrible slaughter. With modern warfare techniques all suffer; those in the front line and those who see their loved ones depart and then live in fear, with despair and prayer alternating in their minds. The dire effects spread far beyond the battlefield.

As Christians we have Christ's words acknowledging we may have enemies, but he doesn't advocate violence against them. By implication his advocacy is to work towards changing the relationship from enmity to friendship. Loving your enemy can surely only anticipate that closeness.

As the 25<sup>th</sup> of April approaches, arrives and passes can we all pray to the Lord for sense, decency and caring to prevail in international relationships. May our prayers be for peace and understanding, not conflict and antagonism.
