What is Te Pouhere? **Te Pouhere Sunday** is the second Sunday after Pentecost, and is the day on which this Church celebrates it's Constitution / Te Pouhere, which establishes the three Tikanga (cultural streams) of this Church in this Province of Aotearoa New Zealand and Polynesia.

The Anglican Church of Aotearoa New Zealand and Polynesia has three beautiful. cultural strands or ways of doing things – Maori, Pakeha and Pasifika.

This relationship came into place in 1992, and the word Te

Pouhere means constitution – which, in te reo, also means a hitching post for a waka. There is one post (Christ) with three wakas tied up to it.
