Jonathan's Words

This morning's reading from St Paul's letter to the church in Rome (Rom 6: 1b - 11) is about the effectiveness of baptism – or at least living out our baptism. It touches on a central issue in living the Christian life. How do we deal with the 'old nature,' that unredeemed part of us that is stubbornly independent of God?

In one sense it is about ignoring it. The old song "Feed the good dog, starve the bad dog," applies. But what undergirds this? What power is available to us as we try to live constructive lives? How do we avoid what has been depicted by one wag in the words, "The trouble is when the old nature knocks on the coffin lid, we go along to see what it wants?"

The deceptively simple answer lies in Verse 11 of our reading. More of that in the sermon.

In the Gospel reading from Matthew (Matt 10: 24 - 39) Jesus makes some pretty clearcut and challenging demands on the Christian disciple. Do you think you can live up to these demands if you've not learnt to deal with the old nature? Give a little thought to how you personally might be assailed by the old nature.

There is a second part to Paul's commentary and that has to do with living in the power of the resurrection life of Christ. If being plunged under the water in baptism is a symbol of burial, being pulled up out of the water symbolises resurrection.

How do we practically live in the power of Christ's resurrection and all that implies? Again, the key is found in Verse 11 of the letter to the Romans. This verse is key – and so is faith. Without faith it is impossible to please God. Anything that is not of faith is sin. Really!? Who said that? Paul did. The context of his saying that is not critical to our understanding of faith, but it highlights one thing: faith is vital to living the Christian life. More of that in the sermon which I've entitled, "How to make God smile."
