Trinity Sunday

I can always think of the clever thing to say when it is far too late. Some time ago, a colleague of a different faith said that he could not understand the idea of God being one and three. I completely failed to explain the Christian concept of The Trinity. Greater minds than mine have struggled with it! I have often thought through what I would say if the opportunity arose again.

How about this: God is like the sun: the creator of all. We cannot look at the sun, just as we cannot look upon the face of God. Jesus is like the light of the sun, the Light of the World, through whom the Father is revealed, and the Holy Spirit is the warmth of the sun that sustains us and gives us life.

That might do for starters, but the number of times I had to revise that paragraph indicates how difficult it is to explain.

The great mystic Julian of Norwich was shown by revelation a small round thing, no bigger than a hazelnut, lying in the palm of her hand. She could see in it three properties: That God made it, God loves it, and God sustains it.

The NZPB puts it like this: The Life-Giver, the Pain-Bearer, the Giver of Life.

These, to me, are explanations of the Trinity that I can understand and hold in my mind without getting in a tangle. Hold a hazelnut in your hand and give it some thought.
