## Jonathan's Word

As I write this I've just got back from attending a Communion Service with the Episcopal Team in an Auckland parish. Parishioners there face much the same challenges as do slightly smaller ministry units. In fact the Bishop preached about the anxiety some face at the thought that the church might disappear. Certainly an extrapolation of the statistics would suggest as much.

In order for us to survive and thrive we will need to undergo a huge cultural shift away from a Christendom model (where the state and church were essentially one in purpose) to a missional outlook, where we each one of us develop a passion to 'gossiping the Gospel,' as one preacher put it.

What would it take for us to develop an urgency about sharing the Good News of Jesus with our neighbours? Well, two things for certain: courage and some knowledge. We can be encouraged by our readings today. In the Gospel reading, Peter was brave enough to walk on water because he looked to Jesus for courage! What do we need to know? Jesus is God's Messiah, who in his life, death and resurrection launched the Kingdom of God. A key component of that was that he forgave our sins. We experience that salvation (in the words of our Romans reading) when you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead. If you do that, you will be saved. Now all of us can draw close to God and look to Jesus for courage, and all of us can understand the simplicity of the Good News. What's more, the Holy Spirit is eager to help us!
