Jonathan's Word

Good Morning One and All!

It is the depth of winter and many are now tired of the rain and damp. When I look out of my office window I can see builders scurrying about while they build a high-rise apartment. Sometimes their cheery calls feel a bit forced. Often they labour away for long periods in silence. There's not much to be cheerful about. I heard a builder say, "G-d, I hate this cold weather!" His fellow worker replied, "It won't last forever, Mate." A word in season, is what the Bible calls it. A little encouragement. In our reading from Peter's second letter this morning he makes reference to a very major "word in season." He misquotes God's words on the Mount of Transfiguration, so let's quote them from Luke's Gospel. 35Then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!' The words are spoken to Peter, James and John, Jesus' flawed but responsive disciples, his inner circle. These are words well worth attending to, and it's clear that all three of these rough diamonds did so. They were some of the leading figures, along with the inimitable St Paul, who led the way in establishing what was a new way of relating to and worshipping God into the future. It was not an easy task but they stuck to it.St Paul describes his attitude in these words in Philippians 3, "but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead. I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." Being flexible and working with change always results in good. Back to Peter in Vs 19b, You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.

Summer will arrive. In the meantime we have a job to do, and that begins with listening to Jesus!
