Jonathan's Word

Can you remember, as a child, coming across someone who just seemed to like you? Not because you had done anything for them. You just found this person clearly was fond of you and shows it by their constant positive attitude towards you. If you can remember such a person, you are blessed indeed. It's not uncommon with small children. They can be quite delightful.

However, it is very seldom that somebody takes a shine (as they used to say) to someone who is obnoxious. Normally we are attracted towards people who are attractive. It's almost as though people are nice to nice people. It's as though they are rewarding them, perhaps subliminally, for their pleasantness. You could almost say that the pleasant person earns positive affirmation by being pleasant.

Adults often use this positive reinforcement to encourage good behaviour. It works powerfully because children are vulnerable and associate people being nice to them with safety, especially if it is an adult showing positive regard.

God doesn't work like that. God gives positive affirmation as a matter of principle. And God manages to do that without confusing us about performance. In other words, it takes quite a bit of built-in performance anxiety to misunderstand God's intentions when we experience his positive affirmation. He never manipulates us. We don't need to earn God's love.

What we're speaking about, of course, is grace. That should be a word that fills us with joy and a sense of flourishing like few words do. It is the essence of the Good News – or at least that part of the Good News that we can apply individually to ourselves. I wonder if you can find the good news in our Gospel reading today.
