## Jonathan's Word

When Jesus enters Jerusalem, things hot up. The clashes he has with the religious authorities intensify. Eventually he silences the Pharisees with his wisdom. Pretty soon word gets to the most senior figures in Judaism, and they are not pleased. Jesus is a threat, socially, religiously and politically. His very presence speaks change, uncomfortable change, the kind that is in effect revolutionary. Things speed up, and on the surface of it, it looks as though it's not going to end well for Jesus.

But is that really true? What Jesus demonstrates is pure love. Love of God and love of neighbour. These eternal and godly principles are put to the test. Is the crucifixion all negative? Does it end in crucifixion? Is that it?

Am I prepared for an exciting ride or will I dig my heels in and risk being drowned? These challenges face us daily.
