Jonathan's Word

We've all heard the saying, "Don't be so heavenly minded that you're of no earthly good." Sometimes we think of God like a Netflix movie, all spectacle and us the spectators. But God is interested in all things, certainly the practical and the mundane. Often it is in the everyday things, especially the needs of people who cannot meet these needs themselves, that we meet Jesus.

In the Gospel reading today two things are contrasted, the Messiah dramatically judging the world, and Jesus praising those who serve people in need. The spectacular tends to do no more than distract us from encountering God. Some of the wisdom that resides in monastic orders is just this: it is in the mundane that we meet God, particularly when it is in service of others.

Service. It's easy to talk about, difficult to begin, but a real joy to continue doing.
