Jonathan's Word

It's a truism that we don't like being woken up when we're fast asleep. But when we're spiritually asleep, we like it even less. However, what really irks, is when the problem is that we can't see clearly and are not sure what's causing it. We only know that we are vulnerable.

The people of Judea in about 30AD were a bit like that. They were a hodgepodge of Jews, Samaritans, some descendants of Greeks from the volent days after Alexander the Great had died, and no small number of Romans there to keep the peace, the infamous *Pax Romana*, which for natives meant, "Do exactly as we say or you'll regret it!" They were split into a number of factions, religious and political. Sadducees, Pharisees, Essenes, the highly political Zealots, followers of the Herods – nicely in bed with the Romans. It was a poor and unstable little province.

And into this is born God Almighty in the form of the Messiah, God's anointed one, Jesus. In his announcement of the Good News of the Kingdom of God, some might have thought, "O yeah. Here's another one. How long will he last, I wonder?"

But Jesus was largely misunderstood. God's ways are not our ways. In personifying love, Jesus was very different from the expected Messiah. In love, he took our sins upon himself and was crucified. But he rose from the dead three days later and to this day holds out his arms to us in love. Jesus is both our Saviour and the Lord of the Universe. His presence is why we simply cannot lose hope. He has triumphed before and he will triumph again. We need to be ready.
